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FOUNDED IN 1878 BY SAMUEL MILLER as one of the nation's first coeducational boarding and day schools. Miller School of Albemarle is a college preparatory school offering grades eight through twelve and a post graduate program. Located on 1,600 acres in the foothills of the Blue Ridge Mountains just west of Charlottesville, Virginia, MSA provides a challenging boarding and day school program of academics, athletics, and fine arts.

MISSION STATEMENT: We create opportunities for discovery and reflection by engaging the **minds**, **hands**, and **hearts** of our students.

FACULTY: Our teaching faculty consists of thirty-five men and women, more than 75% of whom hold advanced degrees.

SCHOOL CALENDAR: Classes meet five days a week for seventy-five minutes. Students can take up to eight credits annually, four per semester. The school year is divided into two semesters. The first semester runs from August to December; the second semester runs from January to May. Furthermore, all students participate in a week-long mini-mester program in January.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM: MSA offers a rigorous yet supportive college-preparatory curriculum. The majority of students carry six academic courses per year. Advanced Placement and Independent Study courses are available, along with a Humanities Program, Dual Enrollment offerings, and an Applied Engineering Program.

AFTERNOON PROGRAMS: All MSA students participate in three seasons of afternoon programming. Afternoon programming includes athletic teams, academic clubs, and other organizations.

The MSA athletic program embodies the spirit of the School's mission by educating the mind, hands, and heart through healthy and balanced athletic competition and team membership. Our athletic teams include but are not limited to basketball, soccer, baseball, swimming, and cross country.

In addition to traditional sports, the MSA Engineering Team competes annually in the Concrete Canoe competition. The Drama program produces an annual musical, theater play, and Spring Honors event. Yearbook curates school memories to assemble the school's yearbook.

ACCREDITATIONS AND AFFILIATIONS: MSA is accredited by the Virginia Association of Independent Schools and the National Association of Independent Schools. MSA is a member of The Association of Boarding Schools, the Small Boarding School Association, the Council for the Advancement and Support of Education, the National Honor Society, and the Secondary Schools Admissions Test Board.

Humanities Program (Certificate of Distinction with Diploma)

The Humanities Program allows students to flourish creatively and scholastically by providing an academic track in Literature, History, Fine Arts, Foreign Languages, and Performing Arts. The program allows students to accumulate credits toward the Humanities Certificate. Credit is awarded for curricular work and cocurricular activities, with more weight being given to Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment options. Program completion culminates in a year long Capstone Project, which is offered via an Independent Study.

Applied Engineering Program (Certificate of Distinction with Diploma)

The Applied Engineering Program is designed to inspire and promote curiosity in this diverse field while exposing students to various disciplines from traditional engineering fields (such as Civil and Mechanical) to more modern engineering fields (such as Biomedical, Environmental, and Chemical). Students will focus academic efforts on the most challenging math and science curriculum that Miller School of Albemarle has to offer at the Advanced Placement and Dual Enrollment levels, while also participating in engineering based cocurriculars, field trips, competitions, and service groups. By graduation, students will have completed a robust Applied Engineering Portfolio of their engineering-related achievements during their time at MSA.

Dual Enrollment

Miller School of Albemarle offers dual enrollment (DE) classes through a partnership with Piedmont Valley Community College (PVCC). Students earn both high school and college credit through DE courses, which are taught on our campus by MSA teachers who hold postgraduate degrees in their respective fields.
